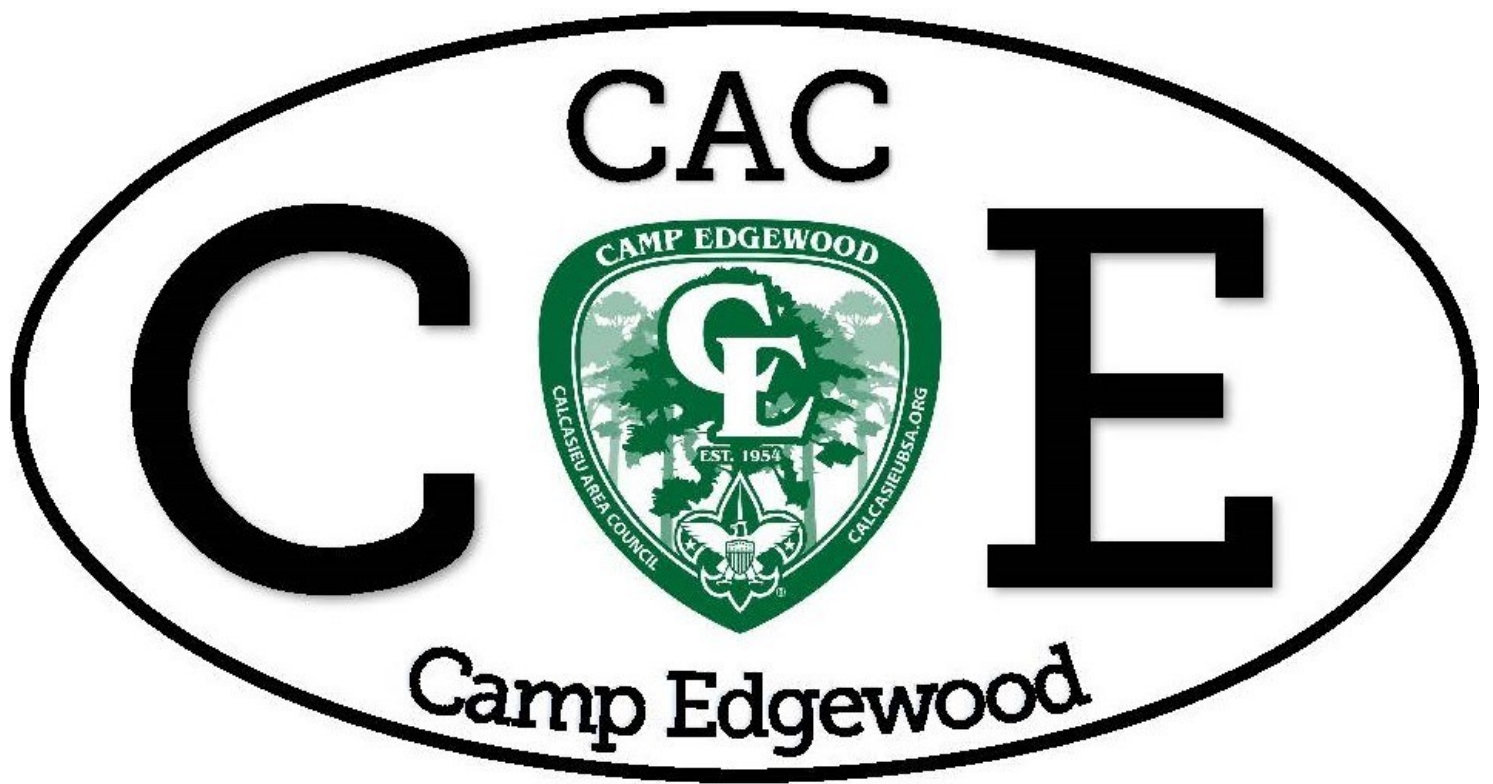


Summer Camp 2.0

Camp 2022

As plans for the Summer 2022 Summer Camp season were being made, it became apparent that what our Scouts really needed was an opportunity to build their summer experiences around a bit more flexibility. Camp Edgewood is recovering from the damaging 18 months that started with Hurricane Laura and our programs are also rapidly improving to make sure we meet the needs of our Scouts. Our goal is to have the best cared for facilities with the strongest program in the region and we are getting closer daily!

While we rebuild our Scouting program in the Calcasieu Area Council, we still want to be able to offer these summer camp experiences to our youth. With our smaller numbers in our Council in mind, we have decided to operate summer camp in a different way for 2022. We will be offering weekend adventures throughout the summer months which focus on different program areas for merit badges while mixing in fun opportunities that are typical of a traditional summer camp. Scouts BSA participants will check in on Friday night and enjoy a welcoming camp fire, attend excellent merit badge opportunities on Saturday and then spend the late afternoon having fun as we open specific areas of camp for their enjoyment in the afternoon. We will host many of our traditional fun summer camp activities on Saturday night including Gaga Ball tournaments, lagniappe Merit Badges like Fingerprinting, Smore's by the campfire, board games with Staff, branding, and more. Sunday morning will have an interfaith service and then a chance to complete more merit badges before our 12:00 p.m. release time. Meals will be provided in the dining hall for each weekend to include all meals Saturday and a warm breakfast on Sunday. Please see our weekend schedule below for the exact merit badges offered for each weekend and the fun afternoon activities to accompany them.

Just for our first year Scouts, our opening weekend will be June 10th—12th. We will offer a deep dive into Brownsea, our first year camper program. We will also include waterfront activities in the afternoon on Saturday to make sure that our First Year Campers get the opportunity to cool off and to work on the waterfront advancement requirements. Since the Swimming Merit Badge is best earned at summer camp, we will be offering that on Sunday (along with a couple of alternatives for our non-swimming friends). This will allow your first year campers to get a taste of summer camp along with basic rank requirements and the Swimming Merit Badge.

Scouts may attend as a provisional camper but we would encourage your Scouts to attend with two adults from your unit if possible. The cost for our Scouts BSA weekends will be \$50 per Scout and \$25 per adult. Please note that all adults must complete Youth Protection Training and bring a certificate with them to camp to be presented at check in. Come to one or to all of the weekend! We have plenty available to meet the needs of all of our Scouts BSA campers! See the pages below for the exact offerings and dates for our Summer 2.0 program!

Are you a Webelos or Arrow of Light Scout? We didn't forget you or your activity filled camp experience. We are shifting the Webelos program to begin Friday, June 10th with a check in at 8:00 a.m. Program will continue until 5 p.m. on Sunday, June 12th. If you have already registered for the Webelos program, we will be calling you to make sure our new schedule meets your needs. This program will be \$100 for the Webelos Scouts and \$40 for each attending adult. The details on your schedule, activities and more are in the pages that follow. For the Webelos and Arrow of Light program this summer, we will complete the following adventures while at Camp Edgewood:

The weekend includes all supplies needed to complete the above listed adventures plus shooting sports. All meals are included from Friday lunch through Sunday lunch and are served in the Dining Hall.

Youth are \$100 and adult partners are \$40 each. There will be many take home projects that will be completed during the weekend as well as a completion report sent with you when you leave for your Pack. All Adults must have completed Youth Protection Training and will need to bring a certificate with them to camp when registering.

What to bring to camp

Scout Field Uniform— Complete including, shirt, shorts, belt, socks, and t-shirts
Medical form including insurance information and parents' signature (parts A and B)
Extra clothing— socks, underwear, shoes, etc.
Bathing suit
Rain Gear
Sleeping bag or bedding
Soap, comb, toothbrush, towel, and other personal items
Scout Handbook, pens & pencils, note-books and meritbadge books
Money for crafts, Trading post items and snacks (\$63 recommended)
Other items such as camera, compass, pack, flashlight, insect repellent, sun-block, water bottle
Lightweight jacket for early mornings as needed.
Brownsea Participants—please bring your Individual History Report from Scoutbook

Individual mess kit and water bottle. Please note that we do not provide plates or eating implements at Camp Edgewood. We will use a 3 bucket system to clean mess kits outside of the dining hall after each meal. Wash/Rinse/Sanitize – please review with your Scouts before you attend Camp Edgewood

General Camp Rules

At Edgewood, the foremost rules for personal and group behavior are the ideals found in Scouting. Scouts and Leaders should follow the Scout Oath, Scout Law, and Outdoor Code for all behaviors.

Beyond these ideals, the following rules are enforced at the Camp Edgewood:

Fireworks are prohibited.

Throwing rocks is forbidden.

All cars must be parked in the camp parking lot unless designated by the Camp Director or Camp Ranger.

Alcoholic beverages and illicit substances are prohibited.

Use of tobacco products is forbidden.

No fixed-blade sheath knives.

No firearms or any kind of ammunition may be kept in the possession of any Scout or adult.

No pets or other animals should be brought to camp (registered service animals permitted).

No aerosol cans in campsites.

All white gas lanterns, propane lanterns, stoves, etc. are to be filled and stored only by adults. Fuel must be secured and locked away.

Closed-toed shoes must be worn at all times. Sandals may only be worn at the waterfront and at the showers.

All campers and visitors must sign-in/sign-out at the camp office.

Two-deep leadership is required at all times for youth. BSA Youth Protection guidelines must be practiced; leaders and parents must be trained and certificates turned in at check in..

No thru traffic in program areas.

No running on trails, bridges, or stairways.

Bicycles are not permitted.

No one may ride in the back of a truck or trailer; seat belts must be worn by anyone in a moving vehicle.

Speed limit in camp is 5 mph. Pedestrians always have the right of way.

No extension cords are allowed unless designated by the Camp Director or Camp Ranger.

No fires or open flames are allowed in tents, Adirondacks, cabins, or any other camp structure.

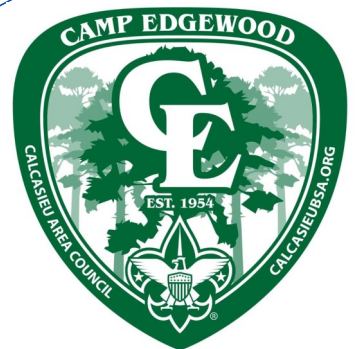
